12:00-1:00 PM: Julia A. Haller, MD is Ophthalmologist-in-Chief of the Wills Eye Institute and Professor and Chair of Ophthalmology at Jefferson Medical College. Dr. Haller became the first female Chief Resident at Wilmer in 1986, and then joined the faculty there. She is President of the American Society of Retina Specialists and a member of the Executive Committee of the Retina Society.

Gills, MD has performed more cataract and lens implant surgeries than any other eye surgeon in the world and was the first in the U.S. to dedicate his practice exclusively to cataract treatment through the use of intraocular lenses. Since establishing his Florida practice in 1968, he has been firmly committed to embracing new technology and perfecting the latest cataract surgery techniques.

Time TBD: Marilyn T. Miller, MD obtained her MD degree and clinical training in ophthalmology at the University of Illinois at Chicago and is Professor of Ophthalmology and faculty of the Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus Section, Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at the University of Illinois. In addition to her research and clinical responsibilities, she participates in children's health fairs in the Chicago area, has a major commitment to international ophthalmology, especially in children's eye programs. She has served on the Advisory Committee of World Health Organization (WHO) and was the American Academy of Ophthalmology representative to the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness (IAPB) for many years.
